ABOUTTHECOLLEGE

Madhab Choudhury College (M.C. College), Barpeta, the fourth oldest college in undivided Assam, was established in the year 1939, when the entire India rose up vigorously against the colonial rule. The inception of this college was a manifestation of an aspiration of a few visionaries, who, imbued with the ideals of the freedom struggle, desired to contribute to building of a vibrant, resurgent, progressive and enlightened India, and with this purpose, wanted to create a generation shining with modern, secular and scientific education in this part of the country. Smt. Jibanlata Choudhury, a philanthropic lady of Barpeta, came forward to help these visionaries reach their goal, and generously donated Rupees ten thousand to start the process of establishment of this college. The untiring and selfless efforts of its founders, duly supported by public donations, emerged as winner, when this pioneering academic institution in the North-East India, named after the husband of this generous lady, was inaugurated by Bharat Ratna Loka Priya Gopinath Bordoloi, erstwhile 'Prime Minister' of Assam, on the 14th of July, 1939.

Since then, M.C. college has been undergoing a relentless process of growth. The college that was started with only twelve teachers and about thirty students is now a premier institution of higher learning with nearly seventy teachers and around two thousand five hundred students. Born as an arts college, M.C. College introduced its science stream in 1959. At present the determined effort of this college is to translate its promise to provide students of this locality with apt facilities for learning in all the streams into a reality.

LOCATION

The College is located at the heart of Satra Nagari Barpeta, the Headquarters of the District of Barpeta. It is nearly 95km from Guwahati and is well connected to the rest of Assam by road and railways. The Barpeta – Baghbor Road is in the east of the college, the FAA Medical College & Hospital Road in the south, the Gandhinagar area in the west, and the municipal market and public bus stand in the north. The location of the college is away from the din and bustle of the town. ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE

- (1) M.C. College Conducts admission process in Online mode. For Admission form and other instructions, the candidate must visit http://www.mccollegeonline.co.in. In the website they must select 'Apply Online' and register themselves.
- (2) WHILE CREATING THE LOG IN ID THE STUDENTS SHOULD USE A FUNCTIONAL 10 DIGIT MOBILE NUMBER.
- (3) After registration the students will be able to download the prospectus. It is advisable to go through the PROSPECTUS before choosing any subject combination. After going through the prospectus, the students must log in to fill up the online form.
- (4) Before filling up the online application form the candidates must keep ready soft copies of the required documents along with photo. The soft copies of the documents have to be uploaded while filling up the online application form.
- (5) The hard copy of the form generated after filling up the online form must be deposited in the College Office.
- (6) The Merit list will be announced in the dates mentioned in notification.
- (7) As per the Govt. OM No AHE.369/2018/17 there will be no face-to-face interview; document verification etc. will be held for admission during the current academic session 2020-21. Mark Sheets, certificates and all other relevant documents will be verified by the competent authority if need be. In this regard the College authority will follow the latest government guidelines.
- (8) Applications are processed and finalized by the Admission Committee.
- (9) Students will collect identity cards on the date of admission.
- (10) If any candidate passed the H.S.L.C. or equivalent examination before the current year, he/she must submit a 'Gap Certificate' from a competent person at the time of admission.
- (11) In case of any dispute about any matter concerning admission, the decision of the principal will be final.
- (12) STUDENTS MUST SUBMIT CORRECT BANK ACCOUNT DETAILS TO AVAIL THE BENEFITS OF GOVERNMENT SCHEMES LIKE SCHOLARSHIPS, REIMBURSEMENT OF HOSTEL MESS DUES, TEXT BOOK GRANTS, ETC.

SOFT COPIES OF DOCUMENTS TO BE UPLOADED

Attested copies of the following documents must be uploaded/attached with the application form:

- (1) Certificate from the Head of the Institution from where he/she passed H.S.L.C or equivalent examination.
- (2) Marksheet of H.S.L.C or equivalent examination.
- (3) Certificate for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/ PH (Physically Challenged) (for students seeking admission under reserved category)
- (4) Address proof.
- (5) Migration Certificate. (If the candidate passed H. S. L. C. or equivalent examination from Boards other than SEBA)
- (6) Proficiency Certificate (If the candidate applies for EC/NCC quota)
- (7) Income Certificate (Not Mandatory)
- (8) Applicant Bank Passbook
- (9) Domicile State Certificate (PRC/Voter ID, NRC/ADHAR card/BPL Card of family/Birth Certificate issued by Registrar of Birth and Death/pass port of Self or parent.)

All the original copies of documents mentioned above must be produced at the time of admission. The applicant must also bring an unattested copy of his/her recent stamp size colour photograph for pasting on Identity Card.

IMPORTANT

- Caste Certificate must be duly countersigned by the concerned authority.
- Students must submit correct Bank Account details to avail the benefits of Government schemes like Scholarships, Reimbursement of Hostel Mess dues, Text Book Grants etc.
- MC College follows the free admission policy of the Govt. of Assam.

Registration and Migration

Registration under AHSEC is compulsory for all students after admission. Students from Boards other than SEBA shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

Procedure for Change of Combination of Subjects:

In the H.S. 1st year, if a student wishes to change the combination of subjects, he/she took up at the time of admission, he/she can apply in a plain paper to the Principal within 15 days from the commencement of classes. Only on reasonable ground such cases may be considered on the basis of merit and availability of seats in the subject (s) the student newly applies for. Candidates must not approach the concerned departments for change of combination of subjects. Application will not be accepted after the stipulated date in any case. Change of combination of subjects is not allowed in the H.S. 2nd year classes, as per the regulations of A.H.S.E.C.

ADMISSION PROCEEDURE FOR UNSUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

- (1) Unsuccessful students of the Higher Secondary Class are generally not considered for regular admission. Of course, in the event of availability of seats, the college authority may consider admitting a few such students on the basis of their earlier academic performances.
- (2) Unsuccessful students who want to appear in the examinations conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council again have to seek permission from the Principal by paying a fee in the office of the college (on Principal's notification) much before the time stipulated for submission of application forms for the examination. Those who have subject (s) with practical have to take admission as casual students and ensure the minimum required attendance in the practical classes.

FREE ADMISSION

M. C. College follows the free admission policy of the Government of Assam. The students applying for free admission must produce all the related documents as prescribed by the Government of Assam at the time of admission.

PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION OF HONOURS, GENERIC ELECTIVE (GE) AND REGULAR SUBJECTS

Each Department has a limited number of seats available for students to take up Honours programme at undergraduate level. In case, the number of applicants exceeds the seat capacity in a particular subject, Honours selection will be done on the basis of a selection test to be conducted by the concerned department. Schedule of Honours selection tests will be notified in the college website. Usually, students will be selected for a particular Honours programme on the basis of Credit Point.

For Calculation of Credit Point following formula will be used.

Credit Point = Percentage of Marks in HS + Marks in HS in the subject applied for Honours

Students will be offered Generic Elective subjects for the BA/BSc Honours programme and Regular subjects for the BA/BSc regular programme strictly on the basis of order of merit.



REGULATIONS AND CURRICULUM UNDER THE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

M C College runs Choice Based Credit System (**CBCS**) at the undergraduate level. BA/BSc with Honours and BA/BSc Regular (without Honours) programmes in the CBCS have courses spread across six-semesters. A typical semester comprises a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic work that will translate into 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters make up an academic year. An undergraduate programme (BA/BSc) consists of six semesters covering three calendar Years.

Duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth)

June to November

Duration of the Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth)

December to May

- Each student must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enrol in the Second Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session.
- The minimum time requirement to acquire a BA/BSc degree is three years. The maximum time allowed to complete the programme is six years.
- A student willing to admit in a BA/BSc programme will have to study different types of courses as per the undergraduate CBCS regulations of Gauhati University.
- The contents of the courses are described in detail in the syllabi. Every course comprises lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, field work, project work or any other activity that addresses the learning objectives of the course.
- Each course credits, assigned on the basis of course related activities, which a student will have to earn through satisfactory fulfilment of the academic requirement of the course.
- A student in a BA/BSc with Honours programme will have to earn 148 credits while a student in a BA/BSc Regular (without Honours) programme will require to earn 132 course credits. Students in an Honours programme can opt to earn additional credits by undertaking additional elective courses subject to the condition that the total number of course credits does not exceed 160 credits. For a student in a regular program, this credit ceiling will be 140 credits. The credits earned beyond the mandatory program requirement will not be taken into consideration in computation of the grade but will be recorded in the grade sheet.

• For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism is adopted:

1 **Credit** = 1 Theory period of one hour duration

1 **Credit** = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration

1 **Credit** = 1 Practical period of two-hour duration

Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)

The Computer Science Department of M.C. College conducts BCA regular course under CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) introduced by Gauhati University.

- Admission to the first semester will take place in the month of July and regular classes will start in the first week of August.
- The duration of the course is 3 years (6 Semesters).
- Eligibility: The candidate must have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent levelexamination from Science/Commerce/Arts Stream. Students who have passed the HigherSecondary examination with either Mathematics or Computer Science as one of the subjectsobtaining minimum pass mark in the subject will be given preference at the time of admission. Students completing Diploma in CSE/IT from AICTE recognized institutes are alsoeligible for taking admission.
- The College may set cut-off marks whenever it seems to be reasonable or may hold admission test for the final selection of candidates
- Students who are not from HS Science stream willhave to take up a bridge course in addition to the normal courses in the 1st semester.
- Fees: Rs. 10, 000 per semester

For details of admission into BCA programme the candidates may contact Head, Department of Computer Science.



ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

- (1) M.C. College conducts admission in Online mode. For Admission form and other instructions, the candidate must visit <u>http://www.mccollegeonline.co.in.</u> In the website they must select 'Apply Online' and register themselves.
- (2) WHIE CREATING THE LOG IN ID THE STUDENTS SHOULD USE A FUNCTIONAL 10 DIGIT MOBILE NUMBER. (STUDENTS ARE REQUESTED TO KEEP THE MOBILE NUMBER ACTIVATED TILL HE/SHE PASSES OUT FROM COLLEGE)
- (3) After registration the students will be able to download the prospectus. It is advisable to go through the PROSPECTUS before choosing any subject combination. After going through the prospectus, the students must log in to fill up the online form.
- (4) Before filling up the online application form the candidates must keep ready soft copies of the required documents along with photo. The soft copies of the documents have to be uploaded while filling up the online application form.
- (5) The hard copy of the form generated after filling up the online form must be deposited in the College Office.
- (6) The Merit list will be announced in the dates mentioned elsewhere.
- (7) The Selected candidates will have to upload their Unique ID (Generated from the DHE Portal), Declaration in the prescribed format and bank details in the college website by logging into their account. Only after updation of the Unique ID and Bank details the student will be admitted into the College. After admission they will receive an SMS in the registered Mobile number.
- (8) The students can also visit <u>http://mccollegeonline.co.in/</u> and see the Notice board for the list of admitted students.
- (9) Applications are processed and finalized by the Admission Committee.
- (10) Students will be able to download their E-Identity Card from their account in the admission portal after their admission is confirmed in M.C. College.
- (11) If any candidate passed the H.S. or equivalent examination before the current year, he/she must upload a 'Gap Certificate' from some competent person.
- (12) In case of any dispute about any matter concerning admission, the decision of the Principal will be final.
- (13) As per the Govt. OM No AHE.369/2018/17 there will be no face-to-face interview, document verification etc. will be held for admission during the current academic session 2021-22. Mark Sheets, certificates and all other relevant documents will be verified by the competent authority if need be. In this regard the College authority will follow the latest government guidelines.

- (6) Proficiency Certificate (If the candidate applies for EC/NCC quota)
- (7) Income Certificate (Not Mandatory)
- (8) Applicant Bank Passbook
- (9) Domicile State Certificate (PRC/Voter ID, NRC/ADHAR card/BPL Card of family/Birth Certificate issued by Registrar of Birth and Death/pass port of Self or parent.)

All the original copies of documents mentioned above must be produced at the time of admission. The applicant must also bring an unattested copy of his/her recent stamp size colour photograph for pasting on Identity Card.

IMPORTANT

- Caste Certificate must be duly countersigned by the concerned authority.
- Students must submit correct Bank Account details to avail the benefits of Government schemes like Scholarships, Reimbursement of Hostel Mess dues, Text Book Grants etc.
- MC College follows the free admission policy of the Govt. of Assam.

FREE ADMISSION

M. C. College follows the free admission policy of the Government of Assam. The students applying for free admission must produce all the related documents as prescribed by the Government of Assam at the time of admission.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

A. CASTE RESERVATION

There is provision for reservation of seats for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes /Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Castes as well as physically Challenged candidates as per the guidelines from the Govt. of India.

B. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITY QUOTA

Provision is also there for reservation of a very limited number of seats for the candidates having shown excellence in sports and culture (at state level in the minimum) as well as the NCC 'A'and 'B' certificate holders and Rajya Puraskar and RastrapatiPuraskar Certificate of Scout & Guide.

Candidates seeking such reservation should select the EC / Sports quota button in the Online Application Form. They must also upload the necessary certificates of their proficiency while filling up the form. In this case, the number of seats will be decided by the admission committee on the basis of the guideline of D.H.E., Assam.

A maximum 5% of the seats may be earmarked as per break up given below for Outstanding Sports Persons / NCC Cadets / proficiency in cultural activities/wards of the employees of the colleges, etc.

- (a) 2% for Sports Persons of sports recognized by IOA/ SAI and also have represented District, State, or The Country or played in the National Level.
- (b) 1 % for wards of employees of the college
- (c) 1 % for NCC/Scouts/ Guides/ NSS
- (d) 1 % for the students with achievements in cultural activities.

These seats will be settled on the basis of merit list of students concerned in each category. The detailed guidelines for filling up of these seats may be finalized by the Governing Body of the College.

Teaching and learning in Online mode

Keeping in view of the current pandemic situation due to Covid-19, our college have postponed the offline mode of teaching as per the guidelines of Government of Assam, University Grant Commission (UGC) and other higher authorities. Classes are now being held in Online mode in Google Meet platform. To attend the online classes, students need to install the Google Meet app in their Android mobile. They can get the information about the online classes in the WhatsApp groups formed for this purpose. In our college, we have WhatsApp groups for all the HS, BA, BSc Honours and Regular classes. Usually, the link for a class is shared by the teacher in the WhatsApp group of the class. Students can also join the online classes through Live Discussion tab in http://mccollegeonline.co.in. Once they enter the class through the Live discussion putting the credentials, their attendances are automatically recorded by the system.

Credits and Attendance

To earn credit in Core Courses, Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses, Generic Elective (GE) Courses, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), students must have at least 75% attendance. The attendance of all courses shall be counted and accounted for in full while determining if the student has met the minimum attendance norms of Gauhati University.

- Attendance means attending direct instruction hours, i.e., theory classes, seminars, workshops, practical, internships, educational trips, field works, project works etc.
- Learning in distance mode or self-learning by library works or by internet hours will not be counted as attendance, unless it is specifically identified and prior approved by the University.
- Basis for calculation of attendance: The basis for the calculation of the attendance shall be the number of hours of contact prescribed by the University.
- In case a student fails to have at least 75 percent attendance, he/she will not be allowed to sit for the end semester examination and hence have to repeat the concerned semester after the successful completion of the subsequent semesters. (For example, if a student fails to secure the necessary credit in the first semester, then he/she can register in the second and subsequent semesters. And only after the successful completion of the sixth semester, can he/she repeat the first semester to earn the deficit credits.)

Leave of Absence

A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination (ESE) except in the following cases:

(i) Medical leave: Any student securing less than 75% due to medical reasons will have to apply for medical leave in a prescribed form (within seven days from the date of absence) accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries. The completed form will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from an authorized medical practitioner. The principal will examine each case of medical absence individually and decide whether it merits exemption.

However, the minimum attendance after accounting for medical leave granted will still have to be 75%. Under no circumstances will a student be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of medical leave, falls below 75%. Such consideration will be subject to the condition that the student must have a minimum of 60% attendance.

(ii) Co-curricular activities (CCA) leave: For absence due to participation in prescribed cocurricular activities (e.g., NCC, NSS, Youth festivals, sports etc.), the claim for CCA leave will have to be made in a prescribed form and supported by authenticated certificates from the concerned authorities. Only those students, whose names are on the list of students made available by the principal as being allowed to participate in such activities, will be considered for CCA leave. The principal will examine each individual case of such CCA leave applied for, and decide whether it merits exemption. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for CCA leave granted will still have to be 75%. Under no circumstances will a student be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of leave for co-curricular activities, falls below 75%.



Evaluation and Examination

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

A. Internal Assessment (IA)

B. End Semester Examination (ESE)

Internal Assessment (IA)

IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper.

- Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/ paper. (For example, if 20 marks is allotted for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept aside for assessment in sessional or mid-term examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks.
- Duration of the examination will be one hour. The question papers of the sessional or midterm examinations will be set by the concerned teacher(s) and the evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the students and corrections will be made, if any.
- 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:

Class attendance from 76% to 80%.	1 mark
Class attendance from 81% to 85%	2 marks
Class attendance from 86% to 90%	3 marks
Class attendance from 91% and above	4 marks

- Rest 30% of the marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:
 - (a) For Practical Courses: Practical
 - (b) For Non-Practical Courses: Home assignments, Seminar/Group discussions,

Field work, Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

 Internal Marks will be scaled up/down to ensure a maximum deviation of 20% from ESE marks

End Semester Examination (ESE)

- The ESE will comprise of 80% of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For odd semesters, ESE will be held in the month of November and for the even semesters, the examination will be held in the month of May.
- Examinations, whether internal or external, theory or practical, would be counted separately for the purpose of considering a student passed or failed.
- If a student does not appear in a paper (internal or external, theory or practical) in an examination, the student will be considered failed in that paper.
- In case a student fails in any one or more papers in an end semester examination, she/he can appear in all the papers in which she/he failed.
- A student having 'arrear' in external examination, either in theory or practical papers, shall be allowed chance to clear the same in the next available end-semester examinations, with the following restrictions:
 - No student will be allowed to appear in the first and fifth semester examinations simultaneously. No student will be allowed to appear in the second and sixth semester examinations simultaneously.
- The first and the fifth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the third semester examination will be held separately. Similarly, the second and the sixth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the fourth semester examination will be held separately.
- A student may be allowed once to reappear in any one of the honours theory papers in each of the first, second and third semesters for betterment of marks if the candidate secured 'pass marks' in all papers. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next similar examination. Marks obtained either in the earlier examination or in the subsequent examination, whichever is higher, will be awarded to the student.
- No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examinations in any semester.
- A student must pass all her/his semester examinations, including 'arrear' and 'betterment' chances within six years from the date of admission to the first semester. In this context, six years means six academic sessions. In the event of a student failing to do so, she/he will have to take fresh admission in the first semester. Subject to the said condition, a student who could not appear or who failed in any semester examination will be allowed chance to clear the same as follows:
 - First semester with regular third semester examination.
 - Second semester with regular fourth semester examination.
 - Third semester with regular fifth semester examination.
 - Fourth semester with regular sixth semester examination.

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

M. C. College Conducts the following regular Post Graduate programmes(M.A./M.Sc.) under Gauhati University.

- (1) M.A. in Assamese (Regular)
 - The department of Assamese runs the MA in Assamese under Gauhati University.
 - Eligibility: B.A. with Assamese Major from any recognized University.
 - Admission Procedure: Admission will be strictly on the basis of entrance exam conducted by the department or as decided by Gauhati University.
 - Number of Seats: 20 (Twenty).

(2) M.Sc in Botany (Regular)

- The department of Botany runs the MSc in Botany under Gauhati University.
- Eligibility: B.Sc. With Major / Honours in Botany from any recognized University.
- Admission Procedure: Admission will be strictly on the basis of entrance exam conducted by the department or as decided by Gauhati University.
- Number of seats:10

P.G.D.C.A. Course (Regular)

(UNDER GAUHATI UNIVERSITY)

- 1. Duration: The duration of the course is one year consisting of two Semesters.
- 2. Admission Procedure: Admission to the first semester course shall take place twice in a year in the months of June and December. For the batch admitted in June, the 1st semester classes will start on the 1st July and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of December. For the batch admitted in December, the 1st semester classes shall start on the 1st January and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of June. The second semester classes and examinations will also follow the same pattern. Colleges that are not interested in running two semesters simultaneously may optfor admitting students once in a year either in June or in December.
- 3. Eligibility: A student with a bachelor's degree of 10+2+3 pattern in any discipline is eligible for the course. However, the colleges may have their own cut-off marks which they find to be suitable for them and/or hold admission test for the final selection. As mentioned in the syllabus, preferably students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level be admitted to the course OR a special bridge course may be designed by the Colleges individually for students not having Mathematics at the Higher secondary level.
- **4. Fees**: Rs. 12,000.00



PROFESSIONAL COURSES

1. DIPLOMA INFISHBREEDING

It is a two-year Diploma Course on Fish breeding (Hatching Worker) with four semesters. This course is run by Community College, M. C. College, Barpeta. Admissions are held depending upon the following criteria:

- Minimum educational qualification is H.S. passed (Science/ Arts/ Commerce).
- Age limit is 18.
- Total admission fees will be Rs. 2500 and per semester Rs.500 is to be paid as tuition fee.

This is a professional course; it helps students and candidates to prepare for job-oriented works. Under the course various mapping design and planning activities are dealt with such as disaster management, soil conservation, planning etc. For GIS& Remote sensing, qualification and training is the strength& opportunity of the course.

6. MAKE-UP AND SPA THERAPY COURSE

A three-month certificate course in collaboration with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and Signature TCAI (Guwahati).

- Age limit: 15 years and above
- Admission Procedure: First come first served basis.

7. BEEKEEPER COURSE

This programme is aimed at training candidates for the job of "Beekeeper" in "Agriculture& Allied" sector / Industry. Aim of this course is to understand bee biology and behaviour, handle beekeeping system and beehive management and manage insects and nuisances in beehive.

FACILITIES

1. Arts Block

It is a combination of four buildings one of which is considered as the Heritage Building. The buildings are divided into different blocks to use as class rooms. Some of the classrooms are named as Kakati Hall, Bagaria Hall, Radhakanta Das Hall and P.K. Talukdar Hall in honour of past Principals and prominent donors of the college.

2. Science Block

This Block is a combination of three buildings. One building houses the Depts. of Chemistry and Physics and the other two-storied building covers two Departments, the ground floor is the Dept. of Zoology and the first floor is the Dept. of Botany. All the science departments have laboratories with all essential equipment/ chemicals/specimens required to deliver and demonstrate practical knowledge of science. Department of Computer Science is well equipped with 30 computers and an air-conditioned laboratory.

3. Kameswar Das Library (Central Library)

The Central Library of the College is named after Kameswar Das, the founder Principal of the College.

• Opening and closing of library:

- Working days: 6 days in a week.
- Working hour: The library remains open from 10a.m. to 5p.m. on all working days.
- Persons entitled to use the library:
 - Regular students of the college
 - The members of the teaching staff
 - The staff of the library, office and laboratory of the college
 - Other person approved individually by the principal

Conditions for borrowing books:

- The students studying in the different classes of the college are entitled to borrow three copies of books at a time for use at home for 15 days. Borrowed books may be re-issued if required for a longer time and if not wanted by another reader.
- The members of the teaching staff are entitled to take out ten volumes at a time for a month.
- The staffs of the library, office and laboratory are entitled to take two books at a time for a month.

- Under special circumstances, the persons enumerated above may with the sanction of the Principal/Librarian, take out more than the prescribed number of volumes.
- No other person is allowed to take out books from the library.
- A book of which there is only one copy in the library is not issued.
- A new book is not normally issued during the first month of the purchase.

Service and facilities:

With a Carpet area of 6000 sq. ft' Kameswar Das Library is a well-equipped, modern library. The With an estimated growth up to 50 thousand books that include text books, reference books, encyclopedias, dictionaries and rare books. Different types of periodicals and research journals are also available in the library. The service of the library is divided in to four sections, namely Book Bank, the Reference/Lending section, e-Library section and Reading Room.

- The library follows Open Access System
- Regarding reprographics service, Xerox machine, Type machine and printers are made available in the library.
- Network version of the SOUL has been installed in the library.
- A Book Bank was established in the library. Meritorious students are allowed to take 2 copies of books for one month from book bank. They are also allowed to renew those books for another two months.
- Internet Service has been introduced and it can be availed both by students and teachers of the college. Ten computers are used for this purpose.
- OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) service has been introduced in the library. Readers can access books through this service. Two Computers have been installed in the entrance of the library for this purpose.

Digital Library:

The digital library of the college is constructed under the College Infrastructure Development scheme of Govt. of Assam. Here at a time 30 students can have access to different online journals subscribed by the college. The library is equipped with 11 computers and one powerful online server.

M.C. College is member of the NLIST ("National Library and Information services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content") Programme. Through the digital Library the students and faculty members can access Thousands of Journals under NLIST programme.

4. Hostel

About Hostel:

M.C. College, Barpeta runs two hostels, one for the Boys and the other for the Girls. Both the two hostels provide basic facilities to the boarders.

Total Seats Boys Hostel- 45 Girls' Hostel- 90

Warden of both Boys' and Girls' Hostel: Dr.Pratyush Purkayastha, 9435541523

Admission to Hostel

- Students will be admitted in order of merit subject to the availability of Seats. Reservation of Hostel seats will be as per Government of Assam norms. Students coming from a long-distance location are provided hostel seats relaxing their merit criteria.
- 2. Application for admission to hostels shall be submitted to the warden in the prescribed application form, filled in and signed by the students and countersigned by his/her local guardian and parent/ guardian.
- 3. On the day of hostel admission, the parents/local guardians/legal guardian as the case may be must be present to complete the necessary formalities.
- 4. Hostel accommodation will not be available to students of part time programmes, such as distance education programme etc. There is no provision for family accommodation in the hostel.
- 5. Students who have been admitted to a hostel, have to occupy their seats as per allotment made by the Warden.
- Students will be allowed to stay in the hostel only for the prescribed period for a degree/diploma and Higher Secondary Course. They will have to vacate the hostel after the examinations are over.
- 7. Any change of address of parents/guardians /local guardians/legal guardian must be intimated immediately to the Warden of the hostel.
- 8. Mess dues must be paid in due time as fixed by the Mess Committee of the hostel. A fine of Rs.50/- will be imposed for late payment of mess dues. A boarder failing to pay mess dues for two consecutive mess terms will forfeit his/her seat.

Withdrawal of Hostel Seat:

Application for withdrawal from the hostel shall be countersigned by the father/mother/guardian and the same is to be submitted to the Warden.

Hostel Timings:

Boarders should strictly adhere to the following hostel timings:

1. For Boys' Hostel

Boarders Should be back by the following times:

a.1st April to 31st October is 7.00 p.m.

b. November 30 to 3th March is 6.00 pm

2. For Girls' Hostel boarders should be back by the following times:

a) 1st April to 31st October is 6.00 p.m.

b)1st November to 31st March is 5.00 p.m.

✤ Medical Cares:

In case of illness of a boarder, the Monitor shall be immediately informed he/she will then inform the local guardian and parents.

- 1. In case of an emergency a patient (boarder) shall be admitted to FAAMCH, Barpeta by the Warden with intimation to the local/legal guardian and parents.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the local guardian/parents/ guardian to take care of their wards and bear all medical expenses.
- 3. First Aids kits will be available in the hostel and Wardens; Monitors and a few boarders will be trained in the application of first aid.

Hostel Leave Rules:

- 1. For seeking leave from the hostel, the boarders must apply in a plain paper. A boarder must obtain prior written permission from the competent authority before proceeding on leave. Girl students are required to intimate permission of their parents regarding their leave from the hostel. Further, they are required to obtain the signature of the parents/ legal guardians on the leave return Form and submit the same to the warden after their return.
- 2. Leave from the hostel for up to four (4) consecutive days shall be granted by the Warden.
- 3. Leave from the hostel for more than four (4) shall be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of the Warden.
- 4. Absence from the Hostel without permission from the Warden will be considered as an act of gross negligence and misconduct, and would be liable for disciplinary action as per rules.
- 5. Hostels shall remain closed during the period of vacation/Semester break or any time as notified by the College authority. During such break/Vacation, boarders are to vacate the rooms of the hostel. The room key and key of the drawer and table must be deposited by the boarders to the Monitor who in turn shall deposit the same with the Warden.

✤ Guests:

Boarders are not allowed to host any guest in the hostel without the written permission of the Warden. No guest Shall be allowed to share room with the boarders unless otherwise specially permitted. The host student shall have to pay the prescribed charges for the guests. No guest shall remain in the hostel for more than 24 hours at a time. Normally, female visitors shall not be allowed to visit Boys' Hostel or vice-versa. However, in exceptional cases this may be relaxed by the Warden.

1. Visiting Hours

For Boys' Hostel- 930.am. to 4.30 pm. For Girls' Hostel- 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 pm.

- 2. Visitors should be received in the visitors' shed. Under Special circumstances, written permission from the warden must be obtained to take visitors.
- Any visitor entering the hostel gate should put his/ her signature and enter relevant particulars in the Columns in the Visitors' Register kept for the purpose at the hostel entrance.

Hostel Affairs Committee:

- Composition
 - a. Principal Chairperson
 - b. Vice Principal- Member
 - c. Warden-Member
 - d. Three Senior teachers form the College- Members (At least one member must be a lady teacher)
- The Hostel Affairs Committee will oversee the management of the hostels, and take up disciplinary matters when necessary.

5. Auditorium

The College auditorium is named after a famous freedom fighter Akshay Kumar Das. The auditorium with technically sound stage and 700 seats is equipped with spacious green room, light and sound system, running water and toilet.

6. Seminar Hall

There is a 200- seater Seminar Hall with state-of-the-art communication system along with

- Separate toilet sets for Ladies & Gents
- Lobby for refreshment
- Facilities for oral presentation

7. Play Ground

The College playground, one of the biggest of its kind in the District of Barpeta, has sufficient playing area for holding district and state level sports events. Sports events during college week are held in the college playground.

8. Guest House

The College has a well-equipped guest house. The Guest House has two rooms with attached bath and kitchen. It also has a dormitory where more than 25 persons can stay comfortably.

9. Women Cell and Research Centre

The College has a Women Cell and research centre where the female faculties can utilize their extra time for research work.

10. Digital Classroom

The College has a World Class Digital Classroom and Video Conferencing Hall. Constructed under the College Infrastructure development scheme of Govt. of Assam this digital classroom has a seating capacity of 70 people. Equipped with Smart board, the classroom felicitates the students to listen to lectures and other programs by the professors of different institutions.

11. Solar Energy Station

There is a solar energy station installed in the college by Assam State Electricity Board. This generates 25 KWs of green energy.

12. Canteen

The canteen is situated at a spacious building where nearly 100 students can have their refreshments at a time. Some highlights of the canteen:

- Separate seating arrangements for teachers/ employees
- Hygienic food at comparatively low cost
- Clean kitchen with modern utensil
- 24-hour running water facility
- Pure drinking water
- Separate toilets for boys and girls.

STUDENTS' WELFARE AND UTILITY SERVICES

- Student's Aid fund: Students' Aid Fund offers fee relaxation/financial assistance to Rank Holders in HSLC/ AHM Class XII Exams, students of BPL families, students of financially unsound families of reserved categories under the Rules and Regulations of the college. Students will have to apply to the Principal for getting such assistance.
- Platinum jubilee Award: Students securing highest aggregate marks in Major in both Arts and Science at the under graduate level is be conferred upon with the Platinum Jubilee Award.
- 3. Health Counseling Cell and Health Center: The 'Health Counseling Cell' of the college offers counseling and other services relating to health matters and also organizes various programs concerning health. Moreover, there is a Health Center at the college, where free health check-up of the students is done once a week by an experienced doctor. The "Health Counseling Cell" takes prompt action when any health-related problem arises in any student during his/her stay at the college.
- 4. Career Guidance and Counseling Cell: The Career Guidance and Counseling Cell of the college guides the aspiring students in matters of different fields of higher education and employment and offers counseling to them in various problems and other matters concerning them.
- 5. Remedial Coaching: Students of Degree classes, belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Minority Communities are given special coaching under the UGC sponsored Remedial Coaching Scheme. In the past sessions, many students from the said categories were benefitted by this coaching.
- **6. Internet facility:** The College campus is Wi Fi enabled. The central library also has internet facility. Students can access this facility free of cost during working hours.
- **7. CCTV Surveillance:** The College campus is under 24 hour CCTV Surveillance. More than 50 cameras keep 24 hours vigil in and around the campus
- 8. Travailing Concession: Travelling concession such as Railway concession is given to students who go for educational tour conducted by the college authority.
- **9. Book Bank:** The Karneswar Das Library has a 'Book Bank', from which books are given to regular students belonging to the following categories:
 - i) The H.S. 1st year students who secured 80% of marks in the H.S.LC. Examination.
 - ii) The H.S. 2nd year students who secured 'A' grade in the H.S. 1st year Examination.

- iii) Two meritorious students of each major and general-course subject in Degree 1st, 2nd and 3rd year classes, on the basis of the result of the last examination.
- iv) Students of Degree 1st, 2nd and 3rd year classes, from economically backward families, who secured the 1St Division in the last examination.
- v) Students belonging to ST, SC and OBC, who secured at last 55% of marks in the last examination.
- **10. Departmental Library:** All the departments of the college have their own libraries with a good stock of text books and reference books in the respective subjects. Students can also borrow books from departmental libraries. The departments follow their own rules in providing books to the students.
- **11. Multi-gym & Iron-gym:** In Order to provide the students with adequate facilities for their physical and emotional wellbeing, the college has one multi-gym and one iron-gym equipped with modern exercising gadgets and equipment backed up by professional staff. These two units of gymnasium help the students towards management of stress as well as preparing a healthy mind in a healthy body. Students can join the gyms as per the rules and regulations formulated by the college authority.
- **12. Drinking water:** Pure drinking water facility for the M.C. College fraternity is made available by installing Aquagards and water coolers in some specific positions inside the college campus.
- 13. Scholarship: The students can avail the following different types of scholarship

 - OBC Scholarship
 - ST Scholarship
 - Assam Higher Secondary Education Council Scholarship

The details of the above scholarships will be notified by the College Office in due time.

14. Sports and Games:

Students are always encouraged to take part in sports and games. Our college has sufficient facilities for many indoor and outdoor games like football, volleyball, cricket, badminton, basketball, table tennis etc. Students of M C College have shown their potential in many sports such as cricket, volleyball etc. at the state and the national level.

CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS

(1) NCC Unit

M.C. College NCC unit is a sub-unit of 7 Assam Bn. NCC, Dhubri. The NCC unit of this college has two wings- Boys and Girls. The cadets of both the wings of this college attended national level camps, prestigious camps like Republic Day camp in New Delhi, Special national integration camp and brought laurels to the college many a time, apart from getting awarded in the Independence Day & Republic Day parades. Many of them also got 'B' and 'C' certificate from the NCC authority.

(2) NSS Unit

The department of Botany initiated to introduce Honours course in the subject in 1970 and since then the course has been successfully running till date offering quality higher education to the students under the curriculum prescribed by the Gauhati University, Guwahati. Since the 2018 Botany Department has been successfully conducting M.Sc (Regular) in Botany under Gauhati University.

Books are regularly issued as per the need of the students. DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry was established in 1959. Since then, the Department has been running the undergraduate course in Chemistry. Every year students passing out from the Department get admission into PG courses in the reputed institutes like University of Hyderabad, IIT Guwahati, Tezpur University, Gauhati University, NEHU, Assam University, NIT Silchar, etc. The Department has four chemistry laboratories—two for degree classes, one for the HS class; the fourth one, which is usually used for research purpose, is equipped with instruments like spectrophotometer, incubator, high performance computers, etc. Department has a library with a collection of more than 300 books including most of the internationally recognized best text books for undergraduate level. DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

The department of Zoology of M.C. College, Barpeta was established on the 1st September, 1959. At the time of establishment of this department a large part of the lower Assam was totally lacking any facilities for science education. At inception, this department started with a very few students, teachers and poor infra-structure. In the last few decades, the department has been marching successfully on its determined path and has grown to be a large and prominent faculty of M.C. College, Barpeta. At present the department is accommodating numbers of students in each Major semester besides the students opting Zoology as a general subject.

The department was founded with three teachers, namely R. K. Singh, H.H. Singh and P.N. Singh. Theory and practical classes were conducted in only two rooms in the present Anthropology block. The department was shifted to the present building in 1966. Presently the department has 5 classrooms, 2 practical laboratories, 2 well equipped research laboratories, 1 well maintained museum and 1 staff room. The department also has a library with a good collection of books. At present the department has a faculty of 6 teachers and 3 laboratory bearers.

Since its inception, the department of Zoology has been marching forward aptly fulfilling its promises by providing the students of this locality with best facilities of learning in the field of zoology and achieve excellence in the field of reality.

The Honours course in Zoology in three-year Degree Course was introduced in 1977. There were five teachers at that time. The 1st batch had only three students.

Presently the department has introduced Skill based Advanced Diploma Courses in Fish Breeding, Organic Farming, Apiculture and Aquarist under UGC's Skill Based Education under National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF).
