Subject: Action Taken Report on Feedback Analysis

Introduction:

In response to feedback received from various stakeholders for the session 2022-23, we conducted a thorough analysis to identify areas for improvement. One of the key findings was the demand for an increased number of digital classrooms to facilitate modern and effective teaching-learning experiences.

Action Taken:

Based on the feedback analysis, the following actions have been implemented:

1. Identification of Requirement: We assessed the current availability of digital classrooms and identified the need for expansion to meet the growing demand.
2. Resource Allocation: Necessary resources were allocated to initiate the expansion process, including funds for infrastructure development and procurement of equipment.
3. Collaboration with Stakeholders: Collaboration with relevant stakeholders, including faculty members, administrative staff, and IT professionals, was initiated to ensure effective planning and implementation.
4. Infrastructure Development: Six additional digital classrooms have been established in strategic locations within the campus, equipped with state-of-the-art technology to support modern teaching methodologies. Four of them are installed with Digital smart board and two with permanent LCD projectors.
5. Training and Capacity Building: Faculty members and support staff have undergone training sessions to familiarize themselves with the operation and maintenance of digital classroom equipment.

Outcome:

As a result of these actions, the number of digital classrooms on campus has been increased by six, addressing the feedback received from stakeholders. The departments of Zoology, Botany, Physics, Mathematics, Economics and Assamese along with that of Chemistry and Computer Science are now equipped with Digital Classroom facilities. This expansion is expected to significantly enhance the teaching-learning experience and promote digital literacy among students and faculty members.

Conclusion:

The successful implementation of this initiative demonstrates our commitment to continuously improving the learning environment and meeting the evolving needs of our educational community. We will continue to monitor feedback and make further enhancements as necessary to ensure an optimal learning experience for all.

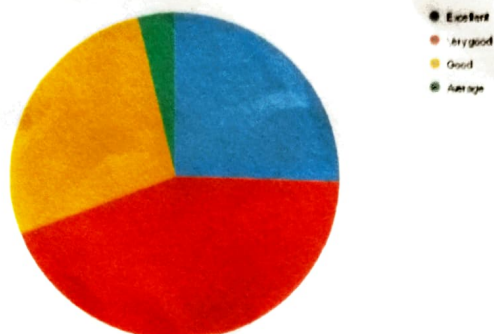

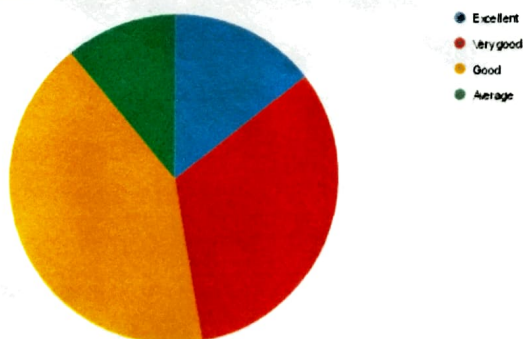
2. Role of course in developing original thinking and innovative idea

Overall, the findings highlight a generally favorable sentiment, suggesting the course's positive impact on intellectual growth and its alignment with the contemporary educational landscape.

Suggestions by the faculty:

The faculty has put forward several important suggestions for the CBCS course, emphasizing its alignment with future job requirements and the need for a curriculum fostering original thinking and innovation. Recommendations include designing the course to enhance employability, addressing concerns about topic repetition in specific papers, modifying practicals to suit available facilities, and integrating experiments into theory sections. The faculty advocates for research-oriented content with proper instrumentation, specificity in the practical part of skill enhancement courses, and the inclusion of practical papers. Additionally, they propose a balanced seat allocation for the SEC paper across departments and call for an upgrade in the suggested reading portion. The suggestions highlight a commitment to providing students with relevant, skill-based learning options and extending project work duration for a more comprehensive academic experience.
