A FIELD VISIT TO KAZIRANGA NATIONAL PARK

We departed from Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta, at 5.30 am and reached Kaziranga National Park around 12.30 pm. Upon arrival, the park official warmly welcomed us and provided an overview of the park's history, geographical location, and key conservation projects undertaken.

The students gained practical knowledge about flora and fauna found in Kaziranga National Park along with the rich cultural diversity of Assam.


The safari in the park allowed students to witness the park's diverse wildlife and understand the need for sustainable tourism and the significance of community involvement.


Conclusion:







