




About the College

Madhab Choudhury College (M.C. College), Barpeta, the fourth oldest college in undivided Assam, was established in the year 1939, when the entire India rose up vigorously against the colonial rule. The inception of this college was a manifestation of an aspiration of a few visionaries, who, imbued with the ideals of the freedom struggle, desired to contribute to building of a vibrant, resurgent, progressive and enlightened India, and with this purpose, wanted to create a generation shining with modern, secular and scientific education in this part of the country. Smt. Jibanlata Choudhury, a philanthropic lady of Barpeta, came forward to help these visionaries reach their goal, and generously donated Rupees ten thousand to start the process of establishment of this college. The untiring and selfless efforts of its founders, duly supported by public donations, emerged as winner, when this pioneering academic institution in the North-East India, named after the husband of this generous lady, was inaugurated by Loka Priya Gopinath Bordoloi, erstwhile 'Prime Ministers of Assam', on the 14th of July, 1939.

Since then, M.C. college has been undergoing a relentless process of growth. The college that was started with only twelve teachers and about thirty students is now a premier institution of higher learning with nearly seventy teachers and more than two thousand five hundred students. Born as an arts college, M.C. College introduced its science stream in 1959. At present the determined effort of this college is to translate its promise to provide students of this locality with apt facilities for learning in all the streams into a reality.





LOCATION

The College is located at the heart of Satra Nagari Barpeta, the Headquarters of the District of Barpeta. It is nearly 90 km from Guwahati and is well connected to the rest of Assam by road and railways. The Barpeta- Baghbor Road is in the east of the college, the FAA Medical College road in the south, the Gandhinagar area in the west, and the municipal market and public bus stand in the north of the college. The location of the college is away from the din and bustle of the town. Valuable trees and lush-green vegetation lend to the college a pastoral magnanimity and perfect platform for intellectual growth in natural ambience.

MISSION

Born at a time when the Freedom Movement of India rose to its peak, M. C. College, Barpeta was the child of a desire in the hearts of some nationalist visionaries to build a strong, independent nation illuminated with knowledge and wisdom. It is in this way that M. C. VISION 2020

Enhancement of infrastructural facilities: The College believes in creating a proper environment for the teaching-learning and research activities as well as the maintenance of a robust work culture. A new administrative block is to be set up with all sorts of facilities The college is committed to provide the students with all sorts of basic amenities, and therefore, it is going to facilitate the students with new Boys' and Girls' Common Rooms. The number of classrooms is to be increased, and some classrooms will be equipped with digital learning facilities. The college is also expanding its Sports infrastructure. A new sports pavilion and Basketball Court is under construction. The Existing Gymnasium is also being upgraded. By 2020 the College will have extensive sports infrastructure.

Widening the academic horizon: M. C. College has geared up to meet all sorts of academic needs pertaining to the changing social milieu. From this academic session, the college is going to introduce both Degree and Diploma courses in Sattriya music so as to contribute to the preservation and expansion of the rich heritage of Sattriya culture. The college is all set to introduce Post Graduate course in Assamese, and by 2020 some other departments will also follow suit. Admission Procedure for Higher Secondary Programme

1. Students are admitted to HIGHER SECONDARY PROGRAMME of the college on the basis of merit. In this regards, decision taken by the authority will be the final. For admission, candidates must apply in prescribed format by the stipulated date. The selected candidates must be present in the interview for admission and they must produce the original copies of marksheet of the H.S.L.C. or equivalent examination passed, certificate from the head of the institution last studied in. Student applying for reserve quota must produce the caste certificate of him / her. A selected candidate must get himself/herself admitted on the date of the interview by paying the necessary fees; otherwise he/she will forfeit the seat.
2. Applications are processed and finalised by the Admission Committee.
3. Students will collect identity cards on the date of admission.
4. If any candidate passed the H.S.L.C. or equivalent examination before the current year, he/she must enclose a 'gap certificate' from some competent person with the admission form.
5. In case of any dispute about any matter concerning admission, the decision of the Principal will be final.

Free Admission :

The Govt of Assam has decided to give free admission to the student belong in to families with income of less than rupees one lakh per annum. The college follows the Govt policy in this regard.

Reservation of Seats :

A) There is provision for reservation of seats for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Castes as well as physically Challenged candidates as per the guidelines from the Govt. of India.

(B) Provision is also there for reservation of a very limited number of seats for the candidates having shown excellence in sports and culture (at state level in the minimum) as well as the NCC 'A' and 'B' certificate holders and Rajya Puraskar and Rastapati Puraskar Certificate of Scout & Guide. Candidates seeking such reservation should submit a separate

application in plain paper with the relevant certificate to the Principal, besides the usual application form within the stipulated date. In this case, the number of seats will be decided by the admission committee on the basis of the guideline of D.H.E., Assam.



Registration and Migration :

Registration under AHSEC is compulsory for all students after admission. Students from Boards other than SEBA shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

Procedure for Change of Combination of Subjects :

In the H.S. 1st year, if a student wishes to change the combination of subjects he/she took up at the time of admission, he/she can apply in a plain paper to the Principal within 15 days from the commencement of classes. Only on reasonable ground such cases may be considered on the basis of merit and availability of seats in the subject (s) the student newly applies for. Candidates must not approach the concerned departments for change of combination of subjects. Application will not be accepted after the stipulated date in any case.


Change of combination of subjects is not allowed in the H.S. 2nd year classes, as per the regulations of A.H.S.E.C.





Admission for Unsuccessful Students :

1. Unsuccessful students of the Higher Secondary Class are generally not considered for regular admission. Of course, in the event of availability of seats, the college authority may consider admitting a few such students on the basis of their earlier academic performances.
2. Unsuccessful students who want to appear in the examinations conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council again have to seek permission from the Principal by paying a fee in the office of the college (on Principal's notification) much before the time stipulated for submission of application forms for the examination . Those who have subject (s) with practical have to take admission as casual students and ensure the minimum required attendance in the practical classes.

- (C) Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) Course.

Admission Procedure for TDC (Arts & Science)

1. Students are admitted to TDC programmes of the college on the basis of merit. In this regard, decision taken by the authority will be final. For admission, candidates must apply in prescribed format by the stipulated date. The selected candidates must be present in the interview for admission, and they must produce the original copies of marksheet of H.S. or equivalent examination, certificate from the head of the institution last studied in and caste certificate (where applicable). A selected candidate must get himself / herself admitted on the date of the interview by paying the necessary fees; otherwise he/ she will forfeit the seat.
2. Applications are processed and finalised by the Admission Committee.
3. Students will collect Identity cards on the date of admission.
4. If any candidate passed the HS or equivalent examination before the current year, he/she must enclose a 'gap certificate' from some competent person with the admission form.
5. In case of any dispute about any matter concerning admission, the decision of the Principal will be final.



Preparation of Merit list and calculation of Credit points

A For undergraduate course (Three Year) Sciences Stream

1. General merit list of Candidates will be prepared according to the marks obtained / Secured in final examination conducted by AHSEC or normalized marks with respect to AHSEC for other Boards or Institutions .
2. List of provisionally selected candidates for major courses in different subjects will be prepared according to credit points calculated from the merit list Prepared. Credit points are obtained by adding marks of the particular subject where major course is offered Desired with total marks of the core subjects excluding English and Mil (or physical education where applicable).



B. For undergraduate course (Three Year) Arts Stream

1. Same as in science Stream
2. List of provisionally selected candidates for Major course in Different subjects Will be prepared according to credit points calculated from the Merit List prepared. Credit points are abstained by adding marks of the particular subjects where major course is offered seeked with total marks of the core subjects including English.
3. If a Candidate changes stream or want to offer/ seek major course in a subjects not studied in the twelveth standard then average marks of the care subjects will be added with the marks of the subjects to obtain credit points instead of particular subjects.

Reservation of Seats :

Procedure for Change of Combination of Subjects :

In the T.D.C 1st Semester if a student wishes to change the combination of subjects he / she took up at the time of admission, he / she can apply in a plain paper to the Principal within 15 days from the commencement of classes. Only on reasonable ground such cases may be considered on the basis of merit and availability of seats in the subject (s) the student newly applies for. Candidates must not approach the concerned departments

for change of combination of subjects. Application will not be accepted after the stipulated date in any case. Subject correction and switch over cases from Major to General course is allowed in the 1st semester only. Student applying for switch over from major to general course need to send the information immediately before submission of the examination form.

Key Points of TDC Semester System for Science and Arts:

1. A T.D.C. course consists of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The schedule for Semester system is as shown below:

(a) First, Third and Fifth Semester: 01 Aug- 31 Dec (including examinations)

(b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January - 15 June (including examinations)

2. Students' performance is monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper is based on the following:
Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks, External Evaluation: 80% Marks

3. Internal Evaluation is based on sessional examination(s), home assignments, Seminars and library work in each Semester.

4. External Evaluation is done through a final examination at the end of the Semester.

5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30 % and that in each practical paper is 40%. Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks External Evaluation: 80% Marks

6. Internal Evaluation is based on sessional examination(s).

7. A student gets maximum three chances to clear a particular semester. Three chances means, three continuous examinations of a particular semester irrespective of whether the student appears or not. For example, a student of 2016 batch will get three chances i.e. 2016, 2017 and 2018, thus, the student shall have to complete his / her all papers of 1st Semester Examination within 2018.

8. Student can apply for repeat examination in one of the theory papers in 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester examinations. The provision for repeat examination is not applicable for 4th, 5th and 6th semester examination no repeat betterment is allowed in the practical examination in any semester.

9. Re-evaluation of answer scripts should be addressed to the Deputy Controller of Examinations, G.U. through the principal within 15 days from the date of declaration of result of the respective examination.

10. In the Semester system there is no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.





11. Students passing in any paper (s) of a semester need to appear in the remaining papers (Failed or not appeared) in the next examination. Students passing in practical paper(s) of a subject need to appear only in theory paper (s) in the subsequent examination.

12. It is mandatory for all students to appear in Sessional Examinations. The minimum mark for passing in each paper is 30% of the total marks.

13. Subject correction and switch over cases from Major to General course is allowed in the 1st semester only.

Student applying for switch over from major to general course need to send the information immediately before the submission of examination form.

14. Application form for Name Correction, withheld Result Clearance, Subject Correction, Duplicate Grade Sheet/Mark Sheet, Admit Card, Re-evaluation of answer scripts etc. may be downloaded from GU website (www.gauhati.ac.in) and to be submitted to the Principal along with necessary documents and fees.

Admission procedure for B.C.A. Course:

(Regular Under Gauhati University)

Admission to the first semester will take place in the month of July and regular classes will start in the first week of August.

The duration of the course is 3 years (6 Semesters).

(i) Eligibility: The applicant must pass H.S. or equivalent examination from any stream with Mathematics as one of the subjects. The College may set cut-off marks whenever it seems to be reasonable or may hold admission test for the final selection of candidates. Students who are not from H.S. Science stream will have to take up a bridge course in addition to the normal courses in the 1st semester.

(ii) Availability of Seats: 20 seats

(iii) Fee: Rs. 8000.00 per semester + 500.00 for one year.

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

P.G.D.C.A. Course (Regular)

(Under Gauhati University)

1. The duration of the course is one year consisting of two Semesters.

2. **Admission:** Admission to the first semester course shall take place twice in a year in the month of June and in the month of December. For the batch admitted on June, the 1st semester classes will start from 1st July and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of December. For the batch admitted in December, the 1st semester classes shall start from 1st January and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of June. The second semester classes and examinations will also follow the same pattern. Colleges that are not interested in running two semesters simultaneously may opt for admitting students once in a year either in June or in December.

3. **Eligibility:** A student with a bachelor's degree of 10+2+3 pattern in any discipline is eligible for the course. However the colleges may have their own cut-off marks which they find to be suitable for them and/or hold admission test for the final selection. As mentioned in the syllabus, preferably students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level be admitted to the course OR a special bridge course may be designed by the Colleges individually for students not having Mathematics at the Higher secondary level.

From the academic session 2012-13, Gauhati University has introduced B.A. (General) Course under distance mode through "Institute of Distance and Open Learning". (IDOL). Students can pursue the B.A. (General) Course with M.I.L. (Assamese /Alt. English) and English as compulsory subjects and Political Science, Education, Philosophy, Economics and History (any two) as subsidiary subjects under semester system. The syllabus and the curriculum for the distance mode courses will be the same as those for the regular courses. The candidates will appear for the end semester examination along with the regular candidates with the same question papers. The Course fees (study materials, counselling and assignment) for the B.A.(General) course under distance mode is Rs. 2000/- per annum excluding the Examinations and Registration fees.



**Guest House:**

The College has a well equipped guest house. The Guest House has Two Rooms with attached bath and Kitchen. It also has a dormitory where more than 25 persons can stay comfortably.

Digital Classroom:

The College has a world Class Digital Classroom and Video Conferencing hall. Constructed under the College Infrastructure development scheme of Govt. of Assam, this digital classroom has a seating capacity of 70 people. About the Certificate Course of Remote Sensing, GIS and GPS

Remote sensing: Remote sensing is the acquisition of information about an object or phenomenon without making physical contact with the object and thus in contrast to on site observation. Remote sensing is used in numerous fields, including geography and most Earth Science disciplines (for example, hydrology, ecology, oceanography, glaciology, geology).

GIS: A Geographical Information System (GIS) is a computer system for capturing, storing, checking and displaying data related to positions on Earth's surface. GIS can show many different kinds of data on one map. This enables people to more easily see, analyze and understand pattern and relationships.

GPS: Global Positioning System (GPS) is a space-based navigation system that provides location and time information in all weather conditions, anywhere on or near the Earth where there is an unobstructed line of sight to four or more GPS satellites. The system provides critical capabilities to military, civil, and commercial users around the world. The United States government created the system, maintains it, and makes it freely accessible to anyone with a GPS receiver. Uses: Mapping data, Proximity analysis, Buffering, Find Clusters, Find Nearest, Location Analysis, Telecom and Network services, Hot spot analysis, Urban & Transport Planning, Agricultural & Environment impact Analysis etc.

Benefits: Being used in applications ranging from transportation planning, urban growth management, market analysis, retail site selection, business logistics, health care planning, epidemiology, facilities management, archaeology, landscape architecture, environmental analysis, natural resource management, hazards mitigation, hazards response and even oceanography and GIS is a growth industry and software firms are always looking for people with the right background.



STUDENT'S CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Uniform dress code

Students must wear the approved college uniform on all working days. The uniform dress code for students of M.C. College is mentioned below.

Summer

For boys: Off White colour shirt, grey colour trousers, Black shoes with black socks.

For girls: i) White salwar, brown kameez, Black shoes without lace, with white socks.

ii) Brown mekhela, white chadar with maroon border, maroon blouse, Black shoe without lace, with white socks.

Winter

Same as above with maroon sweater (for boys and girls). It is mandatory for the students to wear uniform while remaining present at the college on any occasion.

2. Identity Card :

Every students is provided with an Identity Card bearing some vital informations. Students must wear their ID cards in a visible manner at any time inside the campus.

3. Attendance in class :

Students must ensure that they attend their theory and practical classes regularly. They shall be required to attend at least 75% of theorctical and practical classes separately to become eligible to sit for the final Semester Examinations; if not they will be disqualified for the same or face other penalties. The Rate of Penulties will be notified by the Principal in due time.

4. Cancellation of seats

A student failing to attend classes for 30 (thirty) days at a stretch without any valid reason shall forfeit his/ her seat.

5. Anti ragging policy

As per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India M.C College will strictly follow the "UGC regulation on curbing the menace of ragging in higher Educational Institutions 2009". Ragging of any student both inside and outside the campus is a criminal offence and may invite the following stringent measures:

- * Criminal offence as per law passed by state government.
- * Rustication from the college.
- * Embossment on Marksheet, Degree Certificate etc.
- * Penalty and imprisonment for one year.
- * Fine.

The Anti-ragging committee of the college consists of the representative of teachers, students, District& Police administration, guardians and the media.



Some important rules and regulations

- (i) Use of mobile phones inside classroom, laboratory, library, office etc. is strictly prohibited.
- (ii) Students must not remain idle in the verandas, porticos and staircase of any of the college building. Rather they should spend their free time inside the library.
- (iii) On holidays if there is no special class, no student will be loiter in the college premises.
- (iv) Without prior information from the authority, no student will be allowed to stick any bill / notice or to hold any meeting or any other programmes in the college premises.
- (v) Consumption of tobacco, gutkha etc inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- (vi) Any student found guilty of any immoral and indecent act is subject to punitive measure, including rustication.
- (vii) Students should park their bicycles, motor bikes etc at the parking sheds.
- (viii) Students should maintain the cleanliness of the campus. Wastes should be disposed off in the dustbins kept for the purpose.
- (ix) Students must keep an eye on the college notice board regularly so that they do not miss any important notice issued by the college authority.
- (x) Any student involved in loss or damage of any college property will be dealt with very seriously.
- (xi) Ignorance of the rules and regulations will not be accepted as an excuse for their non- observance of them

Students having attendance less than the minimum necessary percentage in class will not be allowed to appear in examinations

FACILITIES

1. Arts Block: It is a combination of three buildings one of which is considered as the Heritage Building. The Buildings are divided into different blocks to use as class rooms. Some of the classrooms are named as Kakati Hall, Bagaria Hall, Radhakanta Das Hall and P.K. Talukdar Hall in honour of past Principals and prominent donors of the college.

2. Science Block: This Block is a combination of two buildings. One building houses the Depts. of Chemistry and Physics and the other two-storied building covers two Departments, the ground floor is the Dept. of Zoology and the first floor is the Dept. of Botany. All the science departments have laboratories with all essential equipments! chemicals! specimens required to deliver and demonstrate practical knowledge of science. Department of Computer Science is well equipped with 30 computers and an air conditioned laboratory.





3. Kameswar Das Library (Central Library)

The Central Library of the College is named After Kameswar Das , the founder Principal of the College.

i). Opening and closing of the library:

- a) Working days: 6 days in a week.
- b) Working hour: The library remains open from 10a.m. to 5p.m. on all working days.

ii). Persons entitled to use the library:

- a) Regular students of the college.
- b) The members of the teaching staff.
- c) The staff of the library, office and laboratory of the college.
- d) Other person approved individually by the principal.

iii). Conditions for borrowing books:

- a) The students studying in the different classes of the college are entitled to borrow three copies of books at a time for use at home for 15 days. Borrowed books may be re-issued if required for a longer time and if not wanted by another reader.
- b) The members of the teaching staff are entitled to take out twenty five volumes at a time for a month.
- c) The staffs of the library, office and laboratory are entitled to two books at a time for a month.
- d) Under special circumstances, the persons enumerated above may with the sanction of the Principal/Librarian, take out more than the prescribed number of volumes.
- e) No other person is allowed to take out books from the library.
- f) A book of which there is only one copy in the library is not issued.
- g) A new book is not normally issued during the first month of the purchase.

iv). Services and facilities:

With a Carpet area of 6000 sq.ft. Kameswar Das Library is a well equipped, modern library. The With an estimated growth up to 50 thousand books that include text books, reference books, encyclopedias, dictionaries and rare books. Different types of periodicals and research journals are also available in the library. The service of the library divided in to four sections, namely Book Bank, the Reference/Lending section, e-Library section and Reading room.

- The library follows Open Access System

-Regarding reprographic service, Xerox machine, Type machine and printers are made available in the library.

-Network version of the SOUL has installed in the library.

-A Book Bank was established in the library. Meritorious students are allowed to take 2 copies of books for one month from book bank. They are also allowed to renew those books for another two months.

-Internet Service has been introduced and it can be availed both by students and teachers of the college. Four computers are used for this purpose.

-OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) service has been introduced in the library. Readers can access books through this service. Two Computers have been installed in the entrance of the library for this purpose.

Hostel Rules

A. Admission to Hostel.

1. Students will be admitted in order of merit subject to the availability of Seats for reserved Category Students, reservation of Hostel seats will be as per Government of Assam norms students coming from a long distance location are provided hostel seats relaxing their merit criteria.
2. Application for admission to hostels shall be submitted to the warden in the prescribed application form, duly filled and signed by the students and countersigned by his/her local guardian and parent/guardian.
3. On the day of hostel admission, the parents/ local guardians/legal guardian as the case may be must be present to complete the necessary formalities.
4. Hostel accommodation will not be available to students of part time programme, such as distance education programme etc. There is no provision for family accommodation in the hostel.
5. Students who have been admitted to a hostel, have to occupy their seat as per allotment made by the Warden.
6. Students will be allowed to stay in the hostel only for the prescribed period for a degree/diploma and Higher Secondary Course. They will have to vacate the hostel after the examinations are over.
7. Any change of address of parents/guardians /local guardians/legal guardian must be intimated immediately to the Warden of the hostel
8. Mess dues must be paid in due time as fixed by the Mess Committee of the hostel. A fine of Rs. 50/- will be imposed for late payment of mess dues. A boarder failing to pay mess dues for two consecutive mess term will forfeit his/her seat.

Withdrawal of Hostel Seat:

Application for withdrawal from the hostel shall be countersigned by the father/mother/guardian and the same is to be submitted to the Warden.

Hostel Timings

Boarders should strictly adhere to the following hostel timings.

1. For Boys' Hostel Boarders Should be back by the following times.
 - a. April 1st to 31st October is 7.00 p.m.
 - b. November 30 to 31st March is 6.00 p.m.
2. For Girls' Hostel boarders should be back by the following times-
 - a. 1st April to 31st October is 6.00 p.m.
 - b. 1st November to 31st March is 5.00 p.m.

Medical Cares

In case of illness of a boarder, the Monitor shall be immediately informed who shall inform the local guardian and parents.



1. In case of an emergency a patient (boarder) shall be admitted to FAAMCH, Barpeta by the Warden with intimation to the local/legal guardian and parents.
2. It shall be the duty of the local guardian/parents/ guardian to take care of their wards and bear all medical expenses.
3. First Aids kits will be available in the hostel and Wardens, Monitors and a few boarders will be trained in the application of first aid.

Hostel Leave Rules.

1. For seeking leave from the hostel, the boarders must apply in a plain paper. A boarder must obtain prior written permission from the competent authority before proceeding on leave. Girls students are required to intimate permission of their parents regarding their leave from the hostel. Further, they are required to obtain the signature of the parents/Legal guardians on the leave return Form and submit the same to the warden after their return.
2. Leave from the hostel for up to four (4) consecutive days shall be granted by the Warden.
3. Leave from the hostel for more than four (4) shall be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of the Warden.
4. Absence from the Hostel without permission from the Warden will be considered as an act of gross negligence and misconduct and would be liable for disciplinary action as per rules.
5. Hostels shall remain closed during the period of vacation/Semester break or any time as notified by the College authority. During such break/Vacation, boarders are to vacate the rooms of the hostel. The room key and key of the drawer and table must be deposited by the boarders to the Monitor who in turn shall deposit the same with the Warden.

Guests

Boarders are not allowed to host any guest in the hostel without the written permission of the Warden. No guest Shall be allowed to share room with the boarders unless otherwise specially permitted. The host student shall have to pay the prescribed charges for the guests. No guest shall remain in the hostel for more than 24 hours at a time.

Visitors

Normally, female visitors shall not be allowed to visit Boys' Hostel or vice-versa. However, in exceptional cases this may be relaxed by the Warden.

1. Visiting Hours

For Boys' Hostel- 9.30.A.m. to 4.30 p.m.

For Girls' Hostel- 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.

2. Visitors should be received in the visitors' shed. Under Special circumstances, written permission from the warden must be obtained to take visitors.
3. Any visitor entering the hostel gate should put his/her signature and enter relevant particulars in the Columns in the Visitors' Register kept for the purpose at the hostel entrance.

- (iii) Two meritorious students of each major and general-course subject in Degree 1st, 2nd and 3rd year classes, on the basis of the result of the last examination.
- (iv) Students of Degree 1st, 2nd and 3rd year classes, from economically backward families, who secured the 1st Division in the last examination.
- (v) Students belonging to ST, SC and OBC, who secured 55% of marks in the last examination.

11. - e) To Develop Mental qualities in Students





DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY
(ESTD. 1959)

The department of Zoology of M.C. College, Barpeta was established on the 1st of September, 1959. At the time of establishment of this department a large part of the lower Assam was totally lacking any facilities for Science education. At inception, this department started with a very few students, teachers and poor infra-structure. In the last few decades the department has been marching successfully on its determined path and has grown to be a large and prominent faculty of M.C. College, Barpeta. At present the department is accommodating numbers of students in each Major semester besides the students opting Zoology as a general subject.

The department was founded with three teachers, namely R. K. Singh, H.H. Singh and P.N. Singh. Theory and practical classes were conducted in only two rooms in the present Anthropology block. The department was shifted to the present building in 1966. Presently the department has 5 classrooms, 2 practical laboratories, 2 well equipped research laboratories, 1 well maintained museum and 1 staff room. The department also has a library with a good collection of books. At present the department has a faculty of 6 teachers and 3 laboratory bearers.

Since its inception, the department of Zoology has been marching forward aptly fulfilling its promises by providing the students of this locality with best facilities of learning in the field of zoology and achieve excellence in the field of reality.

The Honours course in Zoology in three-year Degree Course was introduced in 1977. There were five teachers at that time. The 1st batch had only three students.

Activities:

The teachers as well as students of this department have been actively taking part in solving the problems of the society. The students are motivated to become self reliant and shouldering the social responsibilities in the field of education and research. The teachers and students are also related to various NGOs and social bodies actively engaged in spreading scientific knowledge in the society through participation or organization of seminars, workshops, popular talks, etc.

In the year 1999, Principal of M.C.College, Barpeta constituted a committee, namely "Computer-Zerox Committee" which was entrusted with the responsibility of conducting computer training programmes in the college. In view of growing need of computer education and to meet the challenge of time, the committee undertook different training programmes. Initially it started training programme in collaboration with EPITOME, for imparting computer education. From the session 2002-03 the Computer Science department started "Introductory Computer Science" in 10+2 level. A number of students from both Science and Arts stream selected this subject in 10+2 level. From the session 2004-05, department got the permission to start "Computer Science (General)" subject in B.Sc. course.
