ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Madhab Choudhury College Barpeta, the fourth oldest college in undivided Assam, was established in the year 1939, when the entire India rose up vigorously against the colonial rule. The inception of this college was a manifestation of an aspiration of a few visionaries, who, imbued with the ideals of the freedom struggle, desired to contribute to building of a vibrant, resurgent, progressive and enlightened India, and with this purpose, wanted to create a generation shining with modern, secular and scientific education in this part of the country. Smt. Jibanlata Choudhury, a philanthropic lady of Barpeta, came forward to help these visionaries reach their goal, and generously donated Rupees ten thousand to start the process of establishment of this college. The untiring and selfless efforts of its founders, duly supported by public donations, emerged as winner, when this pioneering academic institution in the North-East India, named after the husband of this generous lady, was inaugurated by Bharat Ratna Loka Priya Gopinath Bordoloi, erstwhile 'Prime Minister' of Assam, on the 14th of July, 1939.

Since then, Madhab Choudhury College has been undergoing a relentless process of growth. The college that was started with only twelve teachers and about thirty students is now a premier institution of higher learning with nearly seventy teachers and around two thousand five hundred students. Born as an arts college, Madhab Choudhury College introduced its science stream in 1959. At present the determined effort of this college is to translate its promise to provide students of this locality with apt facilities for learning in all the streams into a reality.

LOCATION

The College is located at the heart of SatraNagari Barpeta, the Headquarters of the District of Barpeta. It is nearly 95km from Guwahati and is well connected to the rest of Assam by road and railways. The Barpeta – Baghbor Road is in the east of the college, the FAA Medical College & Hospital Road in the south, the Gandhinagar area in the west, and the municipal market and public bus stand in the north. UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

Madhab Choudhury College conducts Four year undergraduate programme:

Gauhati University introduced Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 from academic session 2023-24. So, naturally all the affiliated colleges under Gauhati University, Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta is also going to implement FYUGP. Necessary guidelines regarding the new programme is therefore reproduced here exactly as designed by the University. As per Cabinet decision, Govt. of Assam, Madhab Choudhury College is now under affiliation of Bhattadev University, Bajali.

1|INTRODUCTION

1.1 | Salient features

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor's of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the BVoc degree. The two systems – Bachelor's Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in the following ways.

* Duration

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

* Exits & Entries

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma.

If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

* Honours and Major

Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we

* Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathways.

* Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

Key Points

If you exit in the middle, the doors are still open for you to enter into the programme again and you can start the journey from where you left. No such provisions exists in the CBCS.

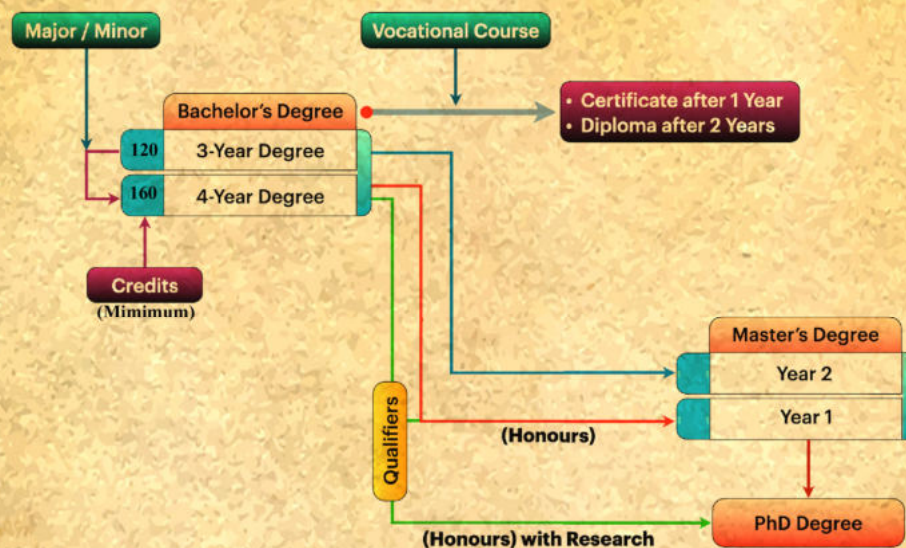


Figure 1.1: Progression under GU-FYUGP

1.3 | How different are the courses?

The major differentiator between the FYUGP and the existing CBCS is the student's ability to study different subjects of choice and also the ability to switch between subjects. Basically, there are two parts of a course under the FYUGP – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses. As the name suggests, different students study different core courses and all students study the common courses. Below, we describe what you will study in different parts of the programme.

* First Year (Semester I & II)

In the first year, one studies three different core subjects – one paper of each subject per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that we have designed as per UGC's Curricular Framework. Details of these courses are described in this booklet.

Second Year (Semester III & IV)

Semester III

In the third semester, one will usually continue with the same core subjects that have already been chosen in the first year and again study some common subjects. In the third semester, one will also take a step forward to study the favourite subject by declaring one of the core subjects as a Major subject and other two as Minors. However, the structure of the programme remains same as in first & second semesters.

Semester IV

From Semester IV onwards, one will primarily study the Major subject by taking at least four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the subject concerned.

As the programme structure in the third semester is same as the first & second semesters, one will have the option of changing the Major in fourth semester to any one of the other two Minors as well, even if one has already declared a Major in the third semester.

However this has the condition that the new Major subject of choice has vacancy.



Third Year

In the third year, one will continue to study the Major subject to complete a full set of 15 papers in Majors.

Fourth Year

If one intends to progress to the fourth year, s/he will be devoting the time in studying advanced courses which will be at the level of initial Master's degree papers. Besides, one will also have the opportunity of engaging into research work with the faculty members.

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP. They are

Open Core Credits

From fourth to sixth semester, one will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilise to study either of the Major or two Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

Double Major

If a student is ready to do some more hard work, s/he can take some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3 / 4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Major.



Key Points

If you would like to change a Minor subjects in the third semester, you can change with the following limitations:

- 1. You will be able to change a subject, provided the new subject can accommodate you. This can be a problem with science subjects as they need to ensure laboratory space for each student.*
- 2. Besides, as you have already abandoned the first year time studying a subject which you no longer want to continue,*

you will need to use your open core credits to compensate for the new subject. This will be more clear once you see the examples we have given afterwards.



Introduction

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has initiated several measures to bring equity, efficiency and excellence in the higher education system of country. The important measures taken to enhance academic standards and quality in higher education include innovation and improvements in curriculum, teaching-learning process, examination and evaluation systems, besides governance and other matters. But due to the various diversities present in the system of higher education, there are multiple approaches followed by universities towards examination, evaluation and grading system. However, the academic reforms recommended by the UGC in the recent past have led to overall improvement in the higher education system. On the basis of the recommendation, apart from the flexibility and freedom in designing the examination, there is a need to devise a sensible system for awarding the grades based on the performance of students, the NEP2020 based Four-Year Under graduate Programme (FYUGP), being adopted by Bhattadev University, is an 8-semester (4-year) programme of 160 credits with multiple exit and entry options at the successful completion of courses assigned at the end of each year.

* Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year.

* Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year.

* Students who opt to exit after completion of the third year and have secured 120 credits will be eligible for the bachelor degree in the major discipline without honours.

* Students after completion of the fourth year and have secured 160 credits will be eligible for the bachelor degree with honours in the major discipline.

* Students are allowed to re-enter the degree programmes within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

Outline of Courses:

The broad categories of courses and minimum credits required for the 4-year Honours degrees as per the UGC document are as follows:

1. Major (Core) course/paper: 80 credits
2. Minor course/paper: 32 credits
3. Interdisciplinary course/paper (IDC): 9 credits
4. Ability Enhancement Course/paper (AEC): 8 credits
5. Skill Enhancement Course/paper (SEC): 9 credits
6. Value Added Course/paper (VAC): 8 credits
7. Summer Internship: 2 credits
8. Research Project/ Dissertation 12 credits (for Honours with Research degree)



The following points may be noted:

* In lieu of the Research Project, a student may study 3 courses each of 4 credits (Le total 12 credits), for the 4-year Honours degrees the Major subject/ discipline requires 80 credits and the Minor subject/ discipline requires 32 credits.

* For a Double Major, the minimum credit requirements are 48 (3-year degree) and 60 (4- year Honours degree) respectively in a subject/ discipline other than the original Major

* In the UGC framework, papers in Major and Minor disciplines are categorized into levels of 100, 200, 300 and 400. Therefore, a course (paper) offered by a Department, say with 4 credits and of level 200, may be taken both as a Major (Core) course by one student and as a Minor course by another student having a different Major discipline, possibly in different semesters.

Definitions of Keywords:

IFYUGP the terminologies those are relevant to the B.Sc. curricula have been briefly described below.

Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.

Semester: Each semester will consist of 15 weeks of regular academic work. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June under normal circumstance.

Programme: An educational programme leading to award of a Certificate, Diploma or Degree (B.Sc. B.A., etc.)

Discipline: This means a particular subject.

Course: Each programme is equipped with a number of courses of various disciplines/subjects. The course of particular discipline/subject refers to the content of the papers the students have to study in that discipline/subject required in obtaining a degree. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures /tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/outreach activities/project work /seminars/assignments/presentations etc. or a combination of any of these

Honours: A particular discipline/subject that a student opts as major subject. (e. g. honours in Physics)

Core Course (CC): A discipline/subject specific compulsory basic course.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): A course designed by a department for enhancement of skill of the students in a particular discipline/subject.

Minor Course (M): A course in a discipline/subject corresponding to a subject other than the major subject.

Value Added Course (VAC): Value-based education to include management of biological resources and biodiversity for the development of humanistic, ethical, sustainable development and living, constitutional, and universal human values of truth, righteous conduct, peace, love, nonviolence, scientific temper, citizenship values, and life skills.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (ABCC): These are compulsory courses. For science programme there will be two of them. AECC-1 is Communicative English & ABCC-2 in Environmental Science.

Vocational Course (VOC): A vocational course is focused on practical work, preparing students for a particular trade or skilled profession. These courses are best for students who have a good idea of their career path and want to gain the knowledge to get there.

 - (f) B.Sc. (IT) – to be introduced from this session.

PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION OF MAJOR/HONOURS AND MINOR SUBJECTS

Each Department has a limited number of seats available for students and the admission will be strictly according to the marks the candidates obtained in the Higher Secondary/ Senior Secondary examination conducted by state or central board. The seat reservation policy will be followed according to the state government specified norms at the time of admission. Details of the Programmes and courses as designed by the Bhattadev University are mentioned hereunder:

Multiple exits & entries

As mentioned before, a student can exit after any year during the FYUGP. Depending on the exit level, a student can get a certificate, diploma, or a degree.

If a student exits after one year into the programme, s/he will be eligible to get a certificate, if she clears all the courses at that point of time. Similarly, s/he will be getting a diploma if s/he exist after two years into the programme, after clearing all the courses up to that point of time. Eventually, after three years, s/he will get a Bachelor's Degree.

It should however be noted that if a student exits the FYUGP at the third year with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he will not be able to seek a reentry afterwards into the fourth year. Rather s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme.

Every student who is in the third year of the FYUGP, can advance to the fourth year. After successful completion of the fourth year, s/he gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research.

Exit Courses

Every students who wants to exit before 3 years into the programme, MUST complete an additional Vocational Course of 4 credits.

Core courses

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects.

The Core Courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered (see the section on Subject Details) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and / or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors.

Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. Please see the examples that we have given in this booklet. A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12.

Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.

Common courses

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry a total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below.

Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects—(i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses are of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

Key Points - A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if s/he has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.



Key points

- * A student can choose any three subjects from the subject groups Arts, Science, and Interdisciplinary.
- * However, the ability to take a subject from a particular group will depend on prerequisites (qualifications that a student must have, see the subsection below on Prerequisites & Requirements) and Group Constraints (see below).
- * All subjects have at least one paper compulsory in all semesters.

Prerequisites, Requirements, & Constraints

The prerequisites are subjects that a student must have studied (and passed) in an earlier level of education (usually Class XI & XII) in order to be able to choose a subject. Essentially, all the levels of a subject have their prerequisites, which are spelled out very visibly in the cover page of a course syllabus.

In contrast to the prerequisites, requirements are certain conditions attached to some core subjects. For example, if a student wants to study Botany as a core subject, Chemistry as another core subjects has to be chosen. This is a 'requirement'. However, if one chooses Chemistry, there is no requirements.

Constraints refer to the maximum number of subjects a student can choose from a particular subject-group. For example, one can choose a maximum of any two subjects from the group – Biological Science & Anthropology. This is a 'constraints' for this group.

Please read further to know the stream-wise subjects with group-constraints.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)

The Computer Science Department of Madhab Choudhury College conducts BCA regular course as “Degree in a Discipline” under NEP-2020 as specified by the Bhattadev University. The BDU-FYUGP has quite a couple of subjects out of which Madhab Choudhury College offers only Computer Application (Bachelor’s in Computer Application) and Information Technology (B.Sc. – IT).

ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

- (1) Before applying for admission in Madhab Choudhury College the students have to register themselves in E-SAMARTH portal.
- (2) For registration in E-SAMARTH portal, they have to visit <https://smamarth.edu.in/>.
- (3) Madhab Choudhury College Conducts admission process in Online mode. For Admission form and other instructions, the candidate must visit <http://www.mccollegeonline.co.in>. In the website they must select ‘Apply Online’ and register themselves.
- (4) While creating the log in ID, the students should use a functional 10-digit mobilenumber(preferably WhatsApp number).
- (5) After registration, the students will be able to download the prospectus. It is advisable to go through the PROSPECTUS before choosing any subject combination. After going through the prospectus, the students must login to fill up the online form.
- (6) Before filling up the online application form, the candidates must keep ready soft copies of the required documents along with photo. The soft copies of the documents have to be uploaded while filling up the online application form.
- (7) The hard copy of the form generated after filling up the online form must be deposited at the time of admission.
- (8) The Merit list will be announced in the dates mentioned in notification.
- (9) Mark Sheets, certificates and all other relevant documents will be verified at the time of admission.
- (10) Students will collect identity cards on the date of admission.
- (11) If any candidate passed the H.S. or equivalent examination before the current year, he/she must submit a ‘Gap Certificate’ from a competent person at the time of admission.
- (12) In case of any dispute about any matter concerning admission, the decision of the principal will be final.
- (13) Students must submit correct bank account details.
- (14) Last date of submission and date of admission will be notified in the college website.

A candidate must first register in DigiLocker using his/her Phone number and AADHAR no and create a 6 digit pin (password). Then he/she has to register in <https://www.abc.gov.in>. There one has to login and select student. Then, in mobile, he/she has to put own mobile no already used in DigiLocker and put the pin already created in DigiLocker. In Academic Bank of Credit, the candidate will select Gauhati University under University. Then he/she has to click the submit button. A twelve digit ABC ID will be created. Note that ID and put it in the online application form of Madhab Choudhury College.

- * Students must submit correct Bank Account details to avail the benefits of Government schemes like Scholarships, Reimbursement of Hostel Mess dues, Text Book Grants etc.
- * Madhab Choudhury College follows the free admission policy of the Govt. of Assam.

FREE ADMISSION

Madhab Choudhury College follows the free admission policy of the Government of Assam. The students applying for free admission must produce all the related documents as prescribed by the Government of Assam at the time of admission.



RESERVATION OF SEATS

A. CASTE RESERVATION

There is provision for reservation of seats for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes /Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Castes as well as physically Challenged candidates as per the guidelines from the Govt. of India.

B. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITY QUOTA

Provision is also there for reservation of a very limited number of seats for the candidates having shown excellence in sports and culture (at state level in the minimum) as well as the NCC 'A' and 'B' certificate holders and Rajya Puraskar and Rastrapati Puraskar Certificate of Scout & Guide.

Candidates seeking such reservation should select the EC / Sports quota button in the Online Application Form. They must also upload the necessary certificates of their proficiency while filling up the form. In this case, the number of seats will be decided by the admission committee on the basis of the guideline of D.H.E., Assam.

A maximum 5% of the seats may be earmarked as per break up given below for Outstanding Sports Persons / NCC Cadets / proficiency in cultural activities/wards of the employees of the colleges, etc.

(a) 2% for Sports Persons of sports recognized by IOA/ SAI and also have represented District, State, or The Country or played in the National Level.

(b) 1% for wards of employees of the college

(c) 1% for NCC/Scouts/ Guides/NSS

(d) 1% for the students with achievements in cultural activities.

These seats will be settled on the basis of merit list of students concerned in each category. The detailed guidelines for filling up of these seats may be finalized by the Governing Body of the College.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End- Semester Examination (ESE) except in the following cases:

(i) Medical leave: Any student securing less than 75% due to medical reasons will have to apply for medical leave in a prescribed form (within seven days from the date of absence) accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries. The completed form will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from an authorized medical practitioner. The principal will examine each case of medical absence individually and decide whether it merits exemption.

However, the minimum attendance after accounting for medical leave granted will still have to be 75%. Under no circumstances will a student be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of medical leave, falls below 75%. Such consideration will be subject to the condition that the student must have a minimum of 60% attendance.

(ii) Co-curricular activities (CCA) leave: For absence due to participation in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g., NCC, NSS, Youth festivals, sports etc.), the claim for CCA leave will have to be made in a prescribed form and supported by authenticated certificates from the concerned authorities. Only those students, whose names are on the list of students made available by the principal as being allowed to participate in such activities, will be considered for CCA leave. The principal will examine each individual case of such CCA leave applied for, and decide whether it merits exemption. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for CCA leave granted will still have to be 75%. Under no circumstances will a student be allowed to appear for the end semester examination or continue with the programme if his/her attendance, after consideration of leave for co-curricular activities, falls below 75%.

Evaluation and Examination

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

A. Internal Assessment (IA)

B. End Semester Examination (ESE)

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

Madhab Choudhury College Conducts the following regular Post Graduate programmes (M.A./M.Sc.) under Bhattadev University.

(1) M.A. in Assamese (Regular)

- The department of Assamese runs the MA in Assamese under Bhattadev University.
- Eligibility: B.A. with Assamese Major from any recognized University.
- Admission Procedure: Admission will be strictly on the basis of entrance exam conducted by the department or as decided by Gauhati University.
- Number of Seats: 20 (Twenty).

(2) M.Sc in Botany (Regular)

- The department of Botany runs the MSc in Botany under Bhattadev University.
- Eligibility: B.Sc. With Major / Honours in Botany from any recognized University.
- Admission Procedure: Admission will be strictly on the basis of entrance exam conducted by the department or as decided by Bhattadev University.
- Number of seats: 20 (Twenty)

P.G.D.C.A. COURSE (REGULAR)

(UNDER BHATTADEV UNIVERSITY)

1. Duration: The duration of the course is one year consisting of two Semesters.

2. Admission Procedure: Admission to the first semester course shall take place twice in a year in the months of June and December. For the batch admitted in June, the 1st semester classes will start on the 1st July and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of December. For the batch admitted in December, the 1st semester classes shall start on the 1st January and the 1st semester examination shall be completed by the middle of June. The second semester classes and examinations will also follow the same pattern. Colleges that are not interested in running two semesters simultaneously may opt for admitting students once in a year either in June or in December.

3. Eligibility: A student with a bachelor's degree of 10+2+3 pattern in any discipline is eligible for the course. However, the colleges may have their own cut-off marks which they find to be suitable for them and/or hold admission test for the final selection. As mentioned in the syllabus, preferably students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level be admitted to the course OR a special bridge course may be designed by the Colleges individually for students not having Mathematics at the Higher secondary level.

4. Fees: Rs. 12,000.00

PROFESSIONAL COURSES

1. DIPLOMA IN FISH BREEDING

It is a two-year Diploma Course on Fish breeding (Hatching Worker) with four semesters. This course is run by Community College, Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta. Admissions are held depending upon the following criteria:

- * Minimum educational qualification is H.S. passed (Science/ Arts/Commerce).
- * Age limit is 18.
- * Total admission fees will be Rs. 2500 and per semester Rs.500 is to be paid as tuitionfee.

A community college is a type of educational institution. It provides work force education. In India 98 community Colleges are recognized by UGC. In Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta, Community college was established in the session 2016-2017. The Community College is sponsored by UGC (Agricultural Skill Development Council).

Community Colleges (CC) serve the following needs:

- * Career oriented education and skills to students interested in directly entering the work force.
- * Training and education programmes for local employers.
- * The syllabus/curriculum has been designed by Agricultural Skill Council of India.
- * Assessment of the 1st semester is fixed on 19 April by Agricultural Skill Development Council of India.
- * Community Colleges offer courses that are a mixture of knowledge and skill components.

2. DIPLOMA/CERTIFICATE IN COMPUTER APPLICATION(DCA)

- * The course is run by the Department of Computer Science, Madhab Choudhury College.
- * Course Duration: 6months.
- * Eligibility: HSLC Passed
- * No. of Seats: 10Seats
- * Fee: Rs.6000/-
- * Admission Procedure: First come first served basis.

3. ADVANCE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION(ADCA)

- * The course is run by the Department of Computer Science, Madhab Choudhury College.

- * No. of Seats:15Seats

4. DIPLOMA IN AGRO TECHNOLOGY

The main aim of this course is to train the youth in some selected areas depending upon the need of the rural agro technology. These courses aim to alleviate the problem of rural poverty and massive unemployment and create self-employment opportunities.

- * Level: Undergraduate
- * Seat Capacity:20
- * Courses offered: (i) Aquarium Construction (ii) Soil & Water testing (iii) Citronella oil production
- * Fees: Rs. 2000/- (For each course, Field visit & Examination fee extra)

This is a professional course; it helps students and candidates to prepare for job-oriented works. Under the course various mapping design and planning activities are dealt with such as disaster management, soil conservation, planning etc. For GIS& Remote sensing, qualification and training is the strength& opportunity of the course.

8. AQUARIUM TECHNICIAN PROGRAMME

5. ANTIRAGGING POLICY

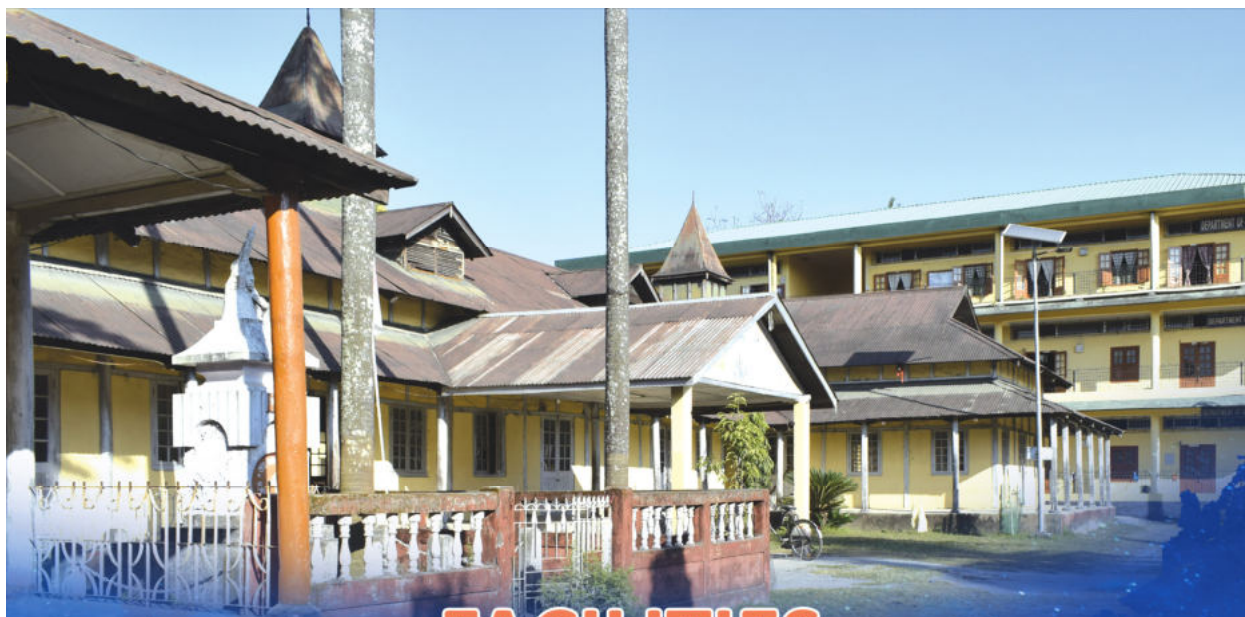
As per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, M.C College will strictly follow the "UGC regulation on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009". Ragging of any student both inside and outside the campus is a criminal offence and may invite the following stringent measures:

- * Criminal procedure as per law passed by the state government.
- * Rustication from the college.
- * Embossment on Marksheet, Degree Certificate etc.
- * Penalty and imprisonment for one year.
- * Fine.
- * The Anti-ragging committee of the college consists of the representatives of teachers, students, District & Police administration, guardians and the media.

GENERAL RULES FOR STUDENTS

- (1) Use of mobile phones inside classroom, laboratory, library, office etc. is strictly prohibited.
- (2) Students must not remain idle in the verandas, porticos and staircase of any of the college building, rather they should spend their free time inside the library.
- (3) On holidays, if there is no special class, no student will be allowed to loiter in the college premises.
- (4) Without prior information from the authority, no student will be allowed to stick any bill notice or to hold any meeting or any other programs in the college premises.
- (5) Consumption of tobacco, gutkha etc inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- (6) Any student found guilty of any immoral and indecent act is subject to punitive measures, including rustication.
- (7) Students should park their bicycles, motor bikes etc. at the parking sheds.

FACILITIES

1. Arts Block

It is a combination of four buildings one of which is considered as the Heritage Building. The buildings are divided into different blocks to use as class rooms. Some of the classrooms are named as Kakati Hall, Bagaria Hall, Radhakanta Das Hall and P.K. Talukdar Hall in honour of past Principals and prominent donors of the college.

2. Science Block

This Block is a combination of three buildings. One building houses the Depts. of Chemistry and Physics and the other two-storied building covers two Departments, the ground floor is the Dept. of Zoology and the first floor is the Dept. of Botany. All the science departments have laboratories with all essential equipment/chemicals/specimens required to deliver and demonstrate practical knowledge of science. Department of Computer Science is well equipped with 30 computers and an air-conditioned laboratory.

3. Kameswar Das Library (Central Library)

The Central Library of the College is named after Kameswar Das, the founder Principal of the College.

- * Opening and closing of library: 9am to 4pm
- * Working days: 6 days in a week.



Persons entitled to use the library:

- * Regular students of the college
- * The members of the teaching staff
- * The staff of the library, office and laboratory of the college
- * Other persons approved individually by the principal

Conditions for borrowing books:

* The students studying in the different classes of the college are entitled to borrow three copies of books at a time for use at home for 15 days. Borrowed books may be re-issued if required for a longer time and if not wanted by another reader.

* The members of the teaching staff are entitled to take out ten volumes at a time for a month.

* The staffs of the library, office and laboratory are entitled to take two books at a time for a month.

* Under special circumstances, the persons enumerated above may with the sanction of the Principal/Librarian, take out more than the prescribed number of volumes.

* No other person is allowed to take out books from the library.

* A book of which there is only one copy in the library is not issued.

* A new book is not normally issued during the first month of the purchase.

Service and facilities:

With a Carpet area of 6000 sq. ft' Kameswar Das Library is a well-equipped, modern library. The With an estimated growth up to 50 thousand books that include text books, reference books, encyclopedias, dictionaries and rare books. Different types of periodicals and research journals are also available in the library. The service of the library is divided in to four sections, namely Book Bank, the Reference/Lending section, e-Library section and Reading Room.

* The library follows Open Access System

* Regarding reprographics service, Xerox machine, Type machine and printers are made available in the library.

* Network version of the SOUL has been installed in the library.

* A Book Bank was established in the library. Meritorious students are allowed to take 2 copies of books for one month from book bank. They are also allowed to renew those books for another two months.

* Internet Service has been introduced and it can be availed both by students and teachers of the college. Ten computers are used for this purpose.

* OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) service has been introduced in the library. Readers can access books through this service. Two Computers have been installed in the entrance of the library for this purpose.



Digital Library:

The digital library of the college is constructed under the College Infrastructure Development scheme of Govt. of Assam. Here at a time 30 students can have access to different online journals subscribed by the college. The library is equipped with 11 computers and one powerful online server.

M.C. College is member of the NLIST ("National Library and Information services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content") Programme. Through the digital Library the students and faculty members can access Thousands of Journals under NLIST programme.

4. Hostel

About Hostel:

Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta runs two hostels, one for the Boys and the other for the Girls. Both the two hostels provide basic facilities to the boarders.

Admission to Hostel

1. Students will be admitted in order of merit subject to the availability of Seats. Reservation of Hostel seats will be as per Government of Assam norms. Students coming from a long-distance location are provided hostel seats relaxing their merit criteria.
2. Application form for admission to hostels will be available online; candidates must submit a duly filled-in form of the same to the college office.
3. On the day of hostel admission, the parents/local guardians/legal guardians as the case may be must be present to complete the necessary formalities.
4. Hostel accommodation will not be available to students of part time programmes, such as distance education programme etc. There is no provision for family accommodation in the hostel.
5. Students who have been admitted to a hostel, have to occupy their seats as per allotment made by the Warden.
6. Students will be allowed to stay in the hostel only for the prescribed period for a diploma and Higher Secondary Course. They will have to vacate the hostel after the examinations are over.
7. Any change of address of parents/guardians /local guardians/legal guardian must be intimated immediately to the Warden of the hostel.
8. Mess dues must be paid in due time as fixed by the Mess Committee of the hostel. A fine of Rs.50/- will be imposed for late payment of mess dues. A boarder failing to pay mess dues for two consecutive mess terms will forfeit his/her seat.



Withdrawal of Hostel Seat:

Application for withdrawal from the hostel shall be countersigned by the father/mother/guardian and the same is to be submitted to the Warden.

Hostel Timings:

Boarders should strictly adhere to the following hostel timings:

1. For Boys' Hostel

Boarders Should be back by the following times:

- a. 1st April to 31st October is 7.00p.m.
 - b. November 30 to 3th March is 6.00pm
2. For Girls' Hostel boarders should be back by the following times:
 - a) 1st April to 31st October is 6.00p.m.
 - b) 1st November to 31st March is 5.00p.m.

Medical Cares:

In case of illness of a boarder, the Monitor shall be immediately informed he/she will then inform the local guardian and parents.

1. In case of an emergency a patient (boarder) shall be admitted to FAAMCH, Barpeta by the Warden with intimation to the local/legal guardian and parents.
2. It shall be the duty of the local guardian/parents/ guardian to take care of their wards and bear all medical expenses.
3. First Aids kits will be available in the hostel and Wardens; Monitors and a few boarders will be trained in the application of first aid.

Hostel Leave Rules:

1. For seeking leave from the hostel, the boarders must apply in a plain paper. A boarder must obtain prior written permission from the competent authority before proceeding on leave. Girl students are required to intimate permission of their parents regarding their leave from the hostel. Further, they are required to obtain the signature of the parents/ legal guardians on the leave return Form and submit the same to the warden after their return.
2. Leave from the hostel for up to four (4) consecutive days shall be granted by the Warden.
3. Leave from the hostel for more than four (4) shall be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of the Warden.
4. Absence from the Hostel without permission from the Warden will be considered as an act of gross negligence and misconduct, and would be liable for disciplinary action as per rules.
5. Hostels shall remain closed during the period of vacation/Semester break or any time as notified by the College authority. During such break/Vacation, boarders are to vacate the rooms of the hostel. The room key and key of the drawer and table must be deposited by the boarders to the Monitor who in turn shall deposit the same with the Warden.



Guests:

Boarders are not allowed to host any guest in the hostel without the written permission of the Warden. No guest shall be allowed to share room with the boarders unless otherwise specially permitted. The host student shall have to pay the prescribed charges for the guests. No guest shall remain in the hostel for more than 24 hours at a time. Normally, female visitors shall not be allowed to visit Boys' Hostel or vice-versa. However, in exceptional cases this may be relaxed by the Warden.

1. Visiting Hours

For Boys' Hostel- 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. For Girls' Hostel- 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.

2. Visitors should be received in the visitors' shed. Under Special circumstances, written permission from the warden must be obtained to take visitors.

3. Any visitor entering the hostel gate should put his/ her signature and enter relevant particulars in the Columns in the Visitors' Register kept for the purpose at the hostel entrance.

Hostel Affairs Committee:

- Composition
 - a. Principal –Chairperson
 - b. Warden-Member
 - c. Three Senior teachers from the College- Members (At least one member must be a lady teacher)
- The Hostel Affairs Committee will oversee the management of the hostels, and take up disciplinary matters when necessary.

5. Auditorium

The College auditorium is named after a famous freedom fighter Akshay Kumar Das. The auditorium with technically sound stage and 700 seats is equipped with spacious green room, light and sound system, running water and toilet.

6. Seminar Hall

There is a 200- seater Seminar Hall with state-of-the-art communication system along with

- * Separate toilet sets for Ladies & Gents
- * Lobby for refreshment
- * Facilities for oral presentation



7. Play Ground

The College playground, one of the biggest of its kind in the District of Barpeta, has sufficient playing area for holding district and state level sports events. Sports events during college week are held in the college playground.

8. Guest House

The College has a well-equipped guest house. The Guest House has two rooms with attached bath and kitchen. It also has a dormitory where more than 25 persons can stay comfortably.

9. Women Cell and Research Centre

The College has a Women Cell and research centre where the female faculties can utilize their extra time for research work.

10. Digital Classroom

The College has a World Class Digital Classroom and Video Conferencing Hall. Constructed under the College Infrastructure development scheme of Govt. of Assam this digital classroom has a seating capacity of 70 people. Equipped with Smart board, the classroom facilitates the students to listen to lectures and other programs by the professors of different institutions.

11. Solar Energy Station

There is a solar energy station installed in the college by Assam State Electricity Board. This generates 25 KWs of green energy.

The canteen is situated in a spacious building where nearly 100 students can have their refreshments at a time. Some highlights of the canteen:

STUDENTS' WELFARE AND UTILITY SERVICES

1. Student's Aid fund: Students' Aid Fund offers fee relaxation/financial assistance to Rank Holders in HSLC/ AHM Class XII Exams, students of BPL families, students of financially unsound families of reserved categories under the Rules and Regulations of the college. The Department of Chemistry was established in 1959. Since then, the Department has been running the undergraduate course in Chemistry. DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

The department of Zoology of Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta was established on the 1st September, 1959. At the time of establishment of this department a large part of the lower Assam was totally lacking any facilities for science education. At inception, this department started with a very few students, teachers and poor infra-structure. In the last few decades, the department has been marching successfully on its determined path and has grown to be a large and prominent faculty of Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta. At present the department is accommodating numbers of students in each Major semester besides the students opting Zoology as a general subject.

The department was founded with three teachers, namely R. K. Singh, H.H. Singh and P. N. Singh. Theory and practical classes were conducted in only two rooms in the present Anthropology block. The department was shifted to the present building in 1966. Presently the department has 5 classrooms, 2 practical laboratories, 2 well equipped research laboratories, 1 well maintained museum and 1 staff room. The department also has a library with a good collection of books. At present the department has a faculty of 6 teachers and 3 laboratory bearers.

Since its inception, the department of Zoology has been marching forward aptly fulfilling its promises by providing the students of this locality with best facilities of learning in the field of zoology and achieve excellence in the field of reality.

The Honours course in Zoology in three-year Degree Course was introduced in 1977. There were five teachers at that time. The 1st batch had only three students.

Presently the department has introduced Skill based Advanced Diploma Courses in Fish Breeding, Organic Farming, Apiculture and Aquarist under UGC's Skill Based Education under National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF).
